LA MONTAGNE DE BUEREN

Belgium's most famous 374 steps.



An iconic Liège landmark, the Montagne de Bueren offers one of the finest views over the city.

Its monumental staircase has become a must-see for visitors and a symbol of the Cité Ardente.

15 minutes' walk from the hotel

LIÈGE-GUILLEMINS STATION

When architecture becomes a work of art.



Designed by Santiago Calatrava, Liège-Guillemins station impresses with its clean lines and spectacular structure.

More than just a railway station, it has become a true symbol of the city.

AMOSAS TIP

Rather than going by car or tram, enjoy a pleasant walk along the banks of the Meuse. The route offers lovely views of the city and lets you discover Liège from a different *perspective*.

About 25 minutes' walk from the hotel, 10 minutes by tram or car

LA BOVERIE

A breath of nature in the heart of Liège.



Located between the Meuse and La Boverie Park, this green island is one of the most pleasant places in Liège for a walk.

It is home to La Boverie Museum, which regularly hosts internationally renowned exhibitions, as well as several restaurants and terraces where you can stop and relax.

Whether for a cultural visit, lunch by the water or simply a stroll, La Boverie is an essential stop during your stay.

AMOSAS TIP

Enjoy a walk through the park and cross the La Belle Liégeoise footbridge to reach the banks of the Meuse. An ideal route for discovering Liège on foot.

About 20 minutes' walk from the hotel, 10 minutes by tram or car.

LE PALAIS DES PRINCES-EVÊQUES

More than a thousand years of history in the heart of Liège.



Located on Place Saint-Lambert, this majestic monument is one of the city's most iconic historic buildings. Its inner courtyard is free to enter and well worth a visit.

AMOSA'S TIP

Take the time to enter the first courtyard of the Palace. Often overlooked, it is open to the public and offers a close-up view of the Renaissance architecture of this iconic monument, away from the bustle of Place Saint-Lambert.

5 minutes' walk from the hotel

PLACE DU MARCHÉ & PERRON

The historic heart of the city.



Surrounded by terraces and historic buildings, Place du Marché is one of the city's liveliest meeting places. At its centre stands the Perron, symbol of Liège's civic freedoms.

AMOSAS TIP

Take a seat on one of the many terraces around the square and enjoy the Liège atmosphere. At the end of the day, the neighbourhood comes alive and becomes one of the liveliest parts of the city centre.

5 minutes' walk from the hotel

CATHÉDRALE SAINT-PAUL

A jewel of Liège heritage.



Recognisable by its Gothic architecture and magnificent cloister, it is also home to the famous Cathedral Treasury.

AMOSAS TIP

Take a seat on one of the many terraces around the square and enjoy the Liège atmosphere. At the end of the day, the neighbourhood comes alive and becomes one of the liveliest parts of the city centre.

5 minutes' walk from the hotel

STROLL & EXPLORE

Take the time to get a little lost... that is often how the best discoveries are made.



Liège is discovered just as much by walking its streets as by visiting its monuments.

Behind every street lies a lively square, a charming alleyway or a terrace where you can stop for a moment.

Follow your curiosity and take the time to explore the city at your own pace.

LES COTEAUX DE LA CITADELLE

The green lung of Liège.



A true haven of greenery in the heart of the city, the Coteaux de la Citadelle offer a network of paths, stairways and hanging gardens. Blending nature and heritage, this walk reveals Liège from another angle, with magnificent viewpoints over the city.

AMOSAS TIP IF

you enjoy peaceful walks, this is one of our favourite places. In spring and autumn alike, the atmosphere is especially pleasant.

15 minutes' walk from the hotel

THE BANKS OF THE MEUSE

A walk along the water.



The riverbanks invite you to enjoy a peaceful stroll along the Meuse. Lined with terraces, green spaces and cycle paths, they provide an ideal setting for walking, running or simply enjoying the view over the river.

AMOSA'S TIP

Head towards Liège-Guillemins station along the riverbanks. It is one of the most beautiful walks in the city.

5 minutes' walk from the hotel

HORS-CHÂTEAU & THE ALLEYWAYS

The charm of old Liège.



With its cobbled lanes, old houses and hidden passages, the Hors-Château district is one of the most authentic parts of the city. It invites you to slow down and discover a more intimate side of Liège.

AMOSA'S TIP

Keep your eyes open: some of the alleyways and inner courtyards are true hidden gems, often overlooked by visitors.

10 minutes' walk from the hotel

LA BELLE LIÉGEOISE

Linking La Boverie Park with the Guillemins district, this elegant footbridge has become a popular place to walk for locals and visitors alike.



AMOSAS TIP

Cross the footbridge at sunset to enjoy the light over the Meuse and admire the city skyline.

EXPLORE LIÈGE BY BIKE

Liège is also best discovered on two wheels.

Thanks to its network of cycle paths, RAVeL routes and numbered-node network, Liège is an ideal starting point for exploring the city and surrounding area at your own pace. Whether you prefer relaxed rides or longer excursions, there is a route for everyone.

RAVeL ROUTES

The RAVeL (Autonomous Network of Slow Ways) is a network of safe routes reserved for cyclists and pedestrians. Former railway lines and towpaths provide pleasant routes away from traffic.

From Liège, several routes allow you to reach:

- Tilff and the Ourthe Valley
- Visé along the Meuse
- Chênée via Line 38
- The Albert Canal

The RAVeL is ideal for families and cycle tourists alike.

THE NUMBERED-NODE NETWORK

The numbered-node network lets you create your own route simply by following a sequence of numbers. Just note the nodes to follow before setting off and let the signs guide you along the way. A new 2026 map covers the entire Province of Liège, and further extensions continue to be developed.

LIÈGE CYCLING MAP

The City of Liège provides a cycling map showing:

- cycle paths;
- recommended routes;
- low-traffic zones;
- bicycle parking;
- travel times between neighbourhoods (Chronomap);
- the main services for cyclists.

The map is available in a pocket format printed on durable paper at the Maison du Tourisme du Pays de Liège (Quai de la Goffe 13, 4000 Liège) and at Pro Vélo Liège (Rue des Bayards 67, 4000 Liège).

RENT A BIKE

To discover Liège without your own bicycle, several options are available:

- KAMEO Bikes, rental of standard and electric bicycles.
- Blue-bike Liège, ideal for travellers arriving by train.

GETTING AROUND LIÈGE

Exploring the city has never been easier.

Whether you choose to walk, take the tram, train or bicycle, Liège offers many easy ways to get around.

From the Amosa, most of the city's must-see attractions are only a few minutes away.

TEC TRAM & BUS

The TEC network serves the entire city and province. The tram now runs through the city centre, while buses provide quick connections to more distant neighbourhoods.

Timetables and tickets are available in the TEC app.

TRAIN

Liège-Guillemins station provides easy connections to Brussels, Bruges, Antwerp, Namur, Maastricht and many other destinations.

Liège-Saint-Lambert and Liège-Carré stations, located near the city centre, also make regional travel easy.

RIVER SHUTTLE

Discover Liège from a different perspective with the river shuttle, which connects several tourist attractions along the Meuse.

BY BIKE

Liège has an extensive cycling network, numerous RAVeL routes and the numbered-node system.

BY CAR

Parking Saint-Denis, located just a few metres from the hotel, is the most convenient place to park your vehicle.

Once parked, we recommend exploring the city centre on foot, by bicycle or by public transport.

AMOSAS TIP

The historic centre of Liège is best explored on foot.

From the hotel, most must-see attractions are less than a 15-minute walk away.

For longer journeys, the tram, buses and bicycles are fast, practical and environmentally friendly alternatives.

MARCH:

Tilff Carnival:

This traditional carnival of the Liège region takes place each year around Laetare (March or early April). For an entire weekend, the village comes alive with dances, activities and, above all, a grand parade on Sunday.



APRIL:

Coteaux Weekend:

More than 20,000 candles illuminate the Coteaux. The idea is simple: lanes, stairways, inner courtyards, hanging gardens and paths are transformed into a magical setting by thousands of candles.



LATE APRIL:

Liège-Bastogne-Liège:

Created in 1892, this cycling race is the oldest of cycling's five "Monuments", earning it the nickname "La Doyenne". Riders follow a demanding route from Liège to Bastogne and back, crossing the Ardennes and its famous climbs.



LATE MAY:

Les Épicuriales:

Every year at Pentecost, La Boverie Park is transformed for five days of open-air gastronomy, with leading Liège restaurateurs serving the best of their cuisine beneath their tents.



JUNE:

Summer Beer Lovers' Festival:

Usually held on the Esplanade des Guillemins or in the city centre.

For several days, dozens of local and international breweries offer a huge selection of craft beers, as well as wine, cocktails, soft drinks and street food. The atmosphere is highly festive, with open-air concerts and DJ sets, making it one of the region's biggest beer-and-party events.



MID-JUNE :

Fête de laMusique ::

A major event where the entire city becomes an open-air stage. Dozens of free concerts fill venues, parks and terraces, with an eclectic programme ranging from rock and electronic music to rap, jazz and classical music.



EARLY JULY:

Les Ardentes:

For several days, international and emerging artists take the stage in an electric atmosphere, drawing visitors from across Europe for an intense, festive and unmissable event.



MID-JULY:

Formula 1 Belgian Grand Prix:

One of the most iconic races in the world championship, held at the legendary Spa-Francorchamps Circuit in the heart of the Belgian Ardennes. At 7.004 km, it is the longest circuit on the Formula 1 calendar and is renowned for legendary corners such as Eau Rouge and Raidillon, offering a unique spectacle for drivers and spectators alike.



LATE JULY:

Les Francofolies de Spa:

One of Belgium's largest music festivals and a summer highlight. Held every year in the heart of the spa town of Spa, the festival mainly celebrates French-language music while also welcoming international artists.



MID-AUGUST:

15 August Festivities:

For several days around 15 August, the entire Outremeuse district becomes a huge street festival with concerts, stalls, processions, a grand folklore parade and many Liège traditions. The highlight is the procession of the Black Virgin followed by the parade of giants, in a lively atmosphere blending folklore, music and conviviality. The festivities symbolically end with a humorous mock funeral, in a typically Liège spirit.



OCTOBER:

October Fair:

A popular annual event that transforms Boulevard d'Avroy into a huge amusement park. Thrill rides, food stalls and a festive atmosphere bring together visitors of all ages in one of the region's great traditions. Be sure to taste the famous lacquemants with Liège syrup at the fair!



DECEMBER:

Christmas Market:

Every winter, Liège transforms its city centre into a magical village with illuminated chalets, warm decorations and a festive atmosphere. Discover artisan products, gourmet specialities and entertainment for everyone, all in a friendly setting filled with Christmas magic in the heart of the Cité Ardente. During this period, you can also enjoy the Christmas market ice rink on Place Cathédrale!
